Contest: Seeking a name for the growth strategy program

Over the past year, Ontario Sheep has been working on a growth strategy for the industry. The findings have been complied into a benchmarking document – a road map to increase farmers' profitability by measuring, learning, and progressing, supported by an extensive value chain analysis of Ontario's lamb and wool industry. Similar programs have been developed and employed in the United States, Australia and New Zealand.

OSMA is turning the strategy into an ongoing program and is seeking suggestions for a name for the program.

About the program

The program was created as a result of the goal of achieving an aggressive growth strategy for the Ontario sheep industry.

The document describes how Ontario's sheep industry can capture the significant opportunities that exist by measuring performance and establish a common language required for individual producers to improve performance by ensuring that production, processing and marketing practices are aligned with customer and consumer needs.

Performance and processing benchmarking is essential to improving the performance of individual farms, downstream businesses, and industry as a whole.

CSBA is requesting Ontario members to participate in vote

The CSBA is asking all of its members to participate in a vote to amalgamate with the Canadian Katahdin Sheep Association. Although the constitutional amendments passed, the response rate was too low to allow amalgamation. The votes received were 97% in favour of amalgamation but only 6% of members voted. A minimum response rate of 25% of members is needed.

A new ballot should have been received by members last week. The CSBA is asking eligible members to participate in the vote and return your ballot in the prepaid envelope as soon as possible.

Last intake for *Growing Forward 2* cost share funding assistance begins May 12

The last intake for applications for Growing Forward 2 cost share funding assistance will be from May 12 to June 1, 2017.

Highlights of the changes include:

- There is no limit to the number of active applications a farm business may have open at any given time.
- Producers may submit up to two applications per application intake to any of the project categories.

GF2 funding can also be used for education and professional development purposes. If you are planning on attending an education event or conference in 2017, you should apply for GF2 funding now. The Sheep Shearing School for Beginners (in late September) and the Advancing Women in Agriculture Conference both qualify for producers to receive some reimbursement for costs under the program.

2017 Grassland Stewardship Program intake now open

Intake two of the 2017 Grassland Stewardship Program (GSP) opens this week, and will accept applications until May 1, 2017. This is the final intake for the 2017 program. The Grassland Stewardship Program is anticipated to return in 2018.

GSP provides funding to implement forage and pasture management Best Management Practices that support the conservation of bobolink and other grassland birds. Eligible activities includes:

Control of encroaching trees and shrubs through mowing;

Pasture rejuvinating;

Incorporating delayed grazing into rotational grazing systems;

Native grassland planting;

Forage harvest management (delayed having).
