## Last call for relaxing cable restraints workshops

The Ontario Fur Managers Federation (OFMF) is offering free workshops on how to properly use relaxing cable restraints (RCRs) - the newly approved tool for predator control in most areas in Ontario.

- How a RCR works including responsible use and placement
- Proper components for a legal RCR in Ontario

## **Utilizing Foodland Ontario branding to promote Ontario lamb**

The Foodland Ontario program drives consumer demand and interest in all Ontario foods. Through various marketing activities, the program encourages consumers to be aware of the breadth, depth, and variety of the fresh food Ontario has to offer. It also encourages consumers to purchase those foods in grocery stores, farmers' markets, on-farm markets, and restaurants across the province. The Foodland Ontario program distributes a wide variety of resources including posters, calendars, recipe books, recipe cards, nutrition guides, and availability guides. These resources are used to connect with consumers and to promote the good things that grow in Ontario.

Those that are engaged in direct marketing of their Ontario lamb products may wish to use the Foodland Ontario branding. 93% of consumers surveyed in 2016 recognized the Foodland Ontario.

Foodland Ontario requires everyone who would like to use their complimentary materials and resources to sign a legally binding Foodland Ontario logo agreement to ensure those materials and resources will only be used to identify Ontario food. It protects the Foodland brand and Ontario growers. The process only has to be completed once.

There are three steps that must be completed in order to get access to and use the Foodland Ontario logo.

- 1) Email Ms. Tobias Clarke (<a href="mailto:tobias.clarke@ontario.ca">tobias.clarke@ontario.ca</a>) with an explanation of how you meet the Foodland Ontario definitions for Ontario foods. The definitions can be found here:

- 2) Sign and return the logo agreement to Foodland by email or fax. Once received, you'll receive a logo package.
- 3) Use the Foodland Ontario logo and resources to identify and market your Ontario food.

## Agrilnvest PIN required to file form electronically to CRA

Starting with the 2016 program year, producers must provide their Participant Identification Number (PIN) to electronically file their Agrilnvest form to the Canadian Revenue Agency.

The PIN is a participant's unique identifier for Agrilnvest. It allows to automatically match a participant's 2016 information to their prior year records and prevents processing delays.

Existing participants can find the PIN on the following statements:

- Annual Statement of Account
- Deposit Notice
- Deposit Confirmation Notice

Only producers who are participating in Agrilnvest for the first time in 2016 will have to request a PIN before they can electronically file a form.

To request a PIN, new Agrilnvest participants must complete a PIN Request Form which is available by:

- calling us toll-free at 1-866-367-8506 to request one.

Once we receive a completed and signed form from a new Agrilnvest participant, a PIN will be sent directly to the participant by mail. For privacy reasons, we will not send the PIN to the participants contact person, including form preparers.

## New certificate available for exporting animals to the EU

The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) has updated Certificate HA2209 for the export of domestic ovines and caprines for breeding and/or production to the European Union.

# Updates to *Growing Forward 2* cost share funding assistance program guide for producers

Changes to the *Growing Forward 2* cost share funding assistance program were recently announced by OMAFRA. These changes will be in effect for applications received for the April 4 to 18, 2017 and May 12 to June 1, 2017 intakes.

Highlights of the changes include:

- There is no limit to the number of active applications a farm business may have open at any given time.
- Producers may submit up to two applications per application intake to any of the project categories

GF2 funding can also be used for education and professional development purposes. If you are planning on attending an education event or conference in 2017, you should apply for GF2 funding now. The Sheep Shearing School for Beginners (in late September) and the Advancing Women in Agriculture Conference both qualify for producers to receive some reimbursement for costs under the program.
